Dear Parents & Carers,

It has been an excellent summer for us as a school with our best-ever GCSE students, another good set of A Level results, and record numbers of new students joining the school. Congratulations to the 340 students who have settled into Year 7 extremely well and all the new students who have joined us in other year groups. Indeed, we now have 1,820 students on roll for the first time ever as our excellent reputation continues to grow.

#### <u>EXAM RESULTS</u>

I'm delighted to report that we've just had our best-ever GCSE results, which feel like a fair reflection of a school that is performing at a consistently high level in so many ways. Whilst the national coverage focused on grades coming down to pre-pandemic levels, we actually achieved our best-ever GCSE results. We are delighted to have performed particularly well at the top end with 98 grade 9s awarded (up from 35 in 2019) and 150 grade 8s awarded (up from 116 in 2019). As a comprehensive school, we achieved 5% grade 9s, 22% grades 9-7, 58% grades 9-5, 75% grades 9-4. At A Level, we achieved 14% grade A\*-A and 64% grades A\*-C. There are so many contributory factors to these results, but they are fundamentally built upon an excellent experience day after day. We have worked hard to increase the discretionary effort of students over recent years and have had hundreds of students attending additional lessons every week over the last couple of years. As I stressed to students in their welcome back assembly, 'the more you put in, the more you get out'.

#### **OPERATIONAL CHANGES**

Invariably we make some tweaks every year to improve the school. This year has seen the introduction of split breaks and lunches which has reduced the numbers of students in the diners and common room, and eased congestion at many lesson changeovers. It has been a lovely, calm first week back.

From Monday all Year 7-11 students are required to wear their school blazer everyday. This will have some practical benefits for students by having pockets for their planner, pens and mobile phone (which those wearing skirts, shorts, leggings or skorts don't have). It will also ensure that students look uniformly smart, have no need to wear a hoodie or sweatshirt, whilst bringing us into line with what is common practice in many schools. Students are still expected to have the school quarter zip top as part of their PE kit and may use it as a school jumper. However, the blazer will be compulsory and, if they do not wish to wear all 3 layers, then the PE quarter zip top should be carried in bags so it can be worn if required in PE lessons. Sixth Form students will also be expected to wear a jacket every day and are not permitted to wear sweatshirts or hoodies either.

We expect students to be proud of their school and dress accordingly as this removes unnecessary arguments, barriers to learning and sanctions. **Please ensure that names are clearly marked on all garments, particularly blazers**. Thank you for your support in ensuring that your child attends school wearing the correct uniform day after day.

### ATTENDANCE MATTERS

At the risk of stating the obvious, if students are not in lessons they are likely to be disadvantaged! If youngsters are struggling and feeling under the weather, please give them some appropriate medication and send them into school, rather than allowing them to stay at home.

The obvious reason for this is the **direct correlation between attendance and achievement** which was reinforced by analysis of our own examination results this summer showing just how missing school significantly reduces the chances of students achieving good examination grades:

### LESSON GRADES and HOME-SCHOOL COMMUNICATION

We are continuing with our 'Attitude to Learning' grades which are entered every lesson to help motivate students and provide regular home-school communication. Positives will be issued for Grade 1 ('Excellent lesson') and for a Grade 2 ('Good' lesson), with the default being a '3' representing 'sufficient work'. Parents will continue to receive a daily automated message whenever a student has a lesson that exceeds or falls short of our expectations. Please note that a 4 will be issued for 'insufficient effort/work' and a 5 for 'poor behaviour'. **Students who receive a grade 4 or 5 during a lesson will automatically be kept behind for 10 minutes by their form tutor to** reinforce the importance of working hard and completing work in lesson.:

As well as these regular electronic communcations, please log onto **My Child at School and check/sign the student planner weekly** to ensure you are aware of other key information. You will receive a weekly email outlining details of homework that has been set via Teams. Please note that homework is mandatory and non-completion will result in students being placed in detention.
