9	<p>Students will learn about the development of democracy in the UK, its key features today and the benefits of living in a liberal democracy compared to some other systems in use currently and in the past throughout the world. Students will then learn about relationships and sex education which includes exploring the ingredients of positive relationships, contraception and some of the risks associated with sex. Students will also receive guidance and advice to help them identify possible signs of child sexual exploitation (CSE). Students will also receive 3 'SPHERE Special' lessons on big issues which this term include recycling week, remembrance and human rights.</p>	<p>Students will learn about different beliefs about life after death from a selection of different faiths. Students will also learn about extremism; its roots, its practice throughout history and ways in which it can be tackled and prevented in line with the government's PREVENT agenda. Students will also receive 3 'SPHERE Special' lessons on big issues which, this term, include remembrance, LGBT history and women's history.</p>	<p>This term, students will learn about effective ways to revise in advance of their end of year assessments. Students will learn about the long-running debate about the existence of God, and arguments (e.g. the ontological argument) for and against. Students will also receive 2 'SPHERE Special' lessons on big issues which, this term, include VE Day and World Environment Day.</p>
