13	<p>Students will largely complete their Independent Coursework Project research during this term. They will be required to locate, examine and interpret a wide range of primary and secondary evidence relevant to their chosen topic.</p> <p>Students will also begin their final examined unit on Popular Culture and the Witchcraze in Early Modern Europe and North America. This term we will focus primarily on the 'popular culture' of Early Modern Europe in all its forms and the witch hunts in Europe.</p>	<p>This term, students should complete their Independent Coursework Project - a 4,000 word essay.</p> <p>Students will also finish most, if not all, of their study into the 'Witchcraze' in various parts of Europe and North America. Students will examine different interpretations of the causes of the Witchcraze, the course of different witch-hunts and the reasons for the decline of witch-hunting.</p>	<p>Students will focus on revising and preparing for their three A Level exams: The Cold War in East Asia Alfred and the Making of England Popular Culture and the Witchcraze in Early Modern Europe and North America.</p>
