## Why study English Literature?

### Subject Specification Outline:

The study of modern literature from 1945, which encourages you to reflect on the changes to Literature post-World War 2. Includes the modern classic drama 'A Streetcar Named Desire'.

### TEXTS IN SHARED CONTEXTS

## Progress Assessment:

Regular, structured exam-style assessments in preparation for two final examinations. Ongoing ½ termly assessment. The independent critical study accounts for 20% of the overall grade and is internally assessed. You will receive written and oral feedback throughout the drafting process.

## Final Exam Format:

Paper 1: Love Through The Ages	Paper 2: Texts in Shared Contexts
3hrs 40% Open book in Section C	2.5hrs 40% Open book

## Non-exam assessment:

### Extended essay of 2500 words and a bibliography

20% of A-Level, assessed by teachers, moderated by AQA

Research particular authors and contexts

Research different literary movements

Read a wide breadth of authors & prepare mini-presentations on them

Complete plans for exercise questions

Complete regular practise questions

Consolidate learning by student mentoring

## Progression Pathways:

A-Level English Literature is a multidisciplinary course of study which affords you opportunities to develop and demonstrate a wide range of study and life skills. You will be encouraged to become perceptive, independent critical readers and thinkers with the skills to communicate complex ideas in both speech and writing. Argumentative skills will be crucial, as will a high level of technical accuracy in written work. In short, this qualification is highly valued by universities and employers.
